**SUMMER SESSION AT POITIERS.** The eleventh summer session of the Centre d'Études Supérieures de Civilisation Médiévale of the University of Poitiers will be held at Poitiers from 9 July to 8 August 1964. **COLOR SLIDES OF THE BOOK OF KELLS.** The most famous illuminated copy of the Gospels in the world, the Book of Kells, is one of Ireland's greatest treasures. Written during the first half of the ninth century at Kells in County Meath, it is now preserved in the Library of Trinity College, Dublin, where it is viewed every year by many thousands of visitors. To meet the ever increasing demand for wider knowledge and understanding of this masterpiece, the Library has issued a selection of thirty-six color slides. The slides, mounted in card with printed titles, are packed in a pocketed album with an introductory note by William O'Sullivan, keeper of the manuscripts at Trinity College. The subjects have been carefully chosen to illustrate different aspects of this beautiful manuscript, from the splendid figure painting

of the evangelical portraits to the great abstract designs built around the forms of the letters. Besides whole page pictures the slides include many most illuminating studies of the detail, which is often of such microscopic fineness that it eludes the naked eye. The set of slides is obtainable only from the Library of Trinity College, Dublin. Orders, accompanied by remittance (£6.6s.), should be sent to the Librarian.

**SUMMER FELLOWSHIPS.** Eight fellowships, each yielding \$1200, are available for post-doctoral faculty members who are working on publishable papers in the humanities (literature, art, history, etc.) dealing with religion. The purpose of the grant is to enable the recipient to forego summer teaching so as to further his research or writing in connection with his paper. Candidates should submit by 1 September 1964 a biographical statement with three supporting letters and a description of the paper. The awards will be announced in November 1964. **NEW PROFESSORSHIPS AT LOUISVILLE.** The University of Louisville announces the gift of Mr and Mrs Barry Bingham for the establishment of chairs for distinguished scholars in the areas of the humanities and history. Appointments may be made for a year or more.

**PHILOSOPHY CONGRESS AT LA MENDOLA.** The Third International Congress of Mediaeval Philosophy will be held at La Mendola (Trento, Italy) from 31 August to 5 September 1964. The general theme will be "The Philosophy of Nature in the Middle Ages."

## CORRIGENDUM

In Appendix I to the "Revised Plan for the Publication of a *Corpus Commentariorum Averrois in Aristotelem*," published in *SPECULUM* (January 1963), I quoted (p. 99) Isaac Abravanel as stating "We in these lands have of the works of Aristotle in our language, together with the Long Commentaries of Averroes, only," etc., in which "in our language (*bi-leshonenu*)"

was my own correction of the printed "in his language (*bi-leshono*)."

I now think that the printed "in his language" is correct and the meaning of Abravanel's statement is: "We in these lands have of the works of Aristotle, containing his full text together with the Long Commentaries of Averroes, only. . . ."
